We have an opportunity for one parish in decline that has liquidated some properties so that we can assign a priest there to see what can be accomplished in the next four years. This is in addition to several parish vacancies that will occur by the summer of June of 2020. The problem is I don’t have anyone to put in these places for now. All the more why we need to encourage our parishes to bring potential candidates for seminary to my attention. We need this annual seminary collection to further support the seven students that are attending this year. These \$1,000 diocesan scholarships per semester are greatly appreciated by our students. I often have received thank you cards or messages of gratitude from students when they receive this support.

There are many options parishes can pursue to collect these funds. Our youth can plan and offer bake sales, car washes, or talent shows. Parishes can put out an extra basket for the month of September for our seminarians. Or parishes may have “Support our Seminarians” as a line item in their budget. Do what you can to help our students. I am grateful to our Lord for whatever you can do.
